Subject: FTTN

Dear Panel members For FTTN.

I am sending this email asking you to very carefully when you chose who is going to build the network. I cant see G9 to build this kind of network as they don't own copper network in Australia. It will be biggest mistake to chose G9 or others

Reason why G9 should not to be chosen:

They will need Telstra cooper to build it means that the Australian state would have to pay \$40 -50 billion to Telstra for the lost of their cooper network, that's mother then the price of building FTTN if it was build by Telstra & Australian state.

Reason 2

Telstra legally own the cooper network and people who bought T3 shares have to compensated at very high cost to the Aust state possible end up in courts for many years.

Reason 3

Technically G9 others will need to use Telstra ducts most are full very small old ducts Telstra wont allow that happen as it will cut their customers lost of business.

Reason 4

G9 or other they don't have experience in building such network at lager scale one of major G9 partner Optus & Opel after 8 month still having a problem to build a simple regional wireless network. I am asking the Panel look at that Optus/Opel risk not chose G9 at all.

Reason 5

Telstra employ 30.000 people should Telstra lose FTTN many people would lose work at Telstra.

Reason 6

Financial G9/Telstra must show the Panel that they have money to build FTTN.

I cant see this network can be build without Telstra it will cost modern \$40 -50 billion to Australian state a biggest risk. I think Mr. Conroy Have one option work with Telstra around the price Telstra want to charge or not to build at all. I pay \$59.00 month basic broadband plus phone rental, most Australian pay same price on basic broadband than if you want very high speed its about \$80.00 a month I don't know with FTTN Telstra want to charge but if they charge \$59.00 basic on FTTN that's about right current price on ADSL.
